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Dear George Nix. Power-Up District Manager,

You have helped my farm operation a great deal, not to mention my families personal vehicles, a great deal with your products. I hope I can help you in return, by letting you know about an occurrence of mine last night (your company may possible be missing out on a segment of the market in which you could be of assistance).

I have recently introduced a new strain of Bermuda grass on my farm (you are aware that I am not afraid to take risks on new products where the potential period of no rain. Rather than take a chance with newly planted sprigs, I opted to use a sprinkler to aid me. As the nursery plot is larger than an acre, I pulled my old "walking sprinkler" (brand unknown) out to cover it. When I attached the hose & turned on the pump, there was so much water loss within the sprinkler that the arms would not even rotate, much less enough to move the unit. I was about to dump the old "walker", when I decided to apply some of your Lubricating Spray to the seals.

I removed for bolts, allowing access to the inside of the sprinkler, & liberally applied the Lube Spray to the seals. After reassembly, I attached the hose seconds, began moving very slowly, then picked up speed over a period of a quarter-minute. I watched the gears to make sure they were operational, then went to the house. I am proud to tell you that the sprinkler navigated through the night, with no visible leakage at the housing. (even better news... we had 3/4 inch of rain overnight, though I don't attribute that to Power Up ... sorry!).

Although Power-Up was developed for prevention of metal-to-metal wear, & you are well aware of it's capability to restore rubber seals & gaskets, you would do a great service to advise anyone with an irrigation system to consider it's use. Especially in places where water is very precious, I believe your products can be extremely beneficial. In large irrigation systems, perhaps "Thixo-Grease" would do an even better job in preserving & restoring seals & gaskets; those "worn-out" rigs might still have a lot of life in them!
