Dear Dan:

I purchased a box of #2 Thixogrease at the Kansas State Fair.

We rent 2,500 acres of Farm Ground in Edwards, Pawnee and Finney counties. The Finney ground is 63 miles from home base. That's 3 1/2 hours one way for our 4-wheel drive 936 Versatile at wide open in road gear. Normally, I service out the tractor before we leave, grease the u-joints when I get there, work the ground, then grease the u-joints, and head home.

Completely by accident (or stupidity), this grease was really put to the test. I serviced the tractor and left at 11:00 a.m. On September 6th. For some reason or another, I forgot to grease when I got there. Thought about it at 3:00 a.m. and figured I'd wait till morning light when I switched fields. Well, at 3:00 p.m. I was almost done so I thought, "Why waste the time now, I'll do it when I'm hooking up the pickup back to the implement to head home." Well I brain farted again, thought of it as I was pulling in the driveway at home at 8:00 p.m. That's 33 hours nonstop running, 7 hours in road gear.

The next day, as I was servicing it out, I noticed something truly amazing. The u-joints, which normally took 6 squirts with my hand grease gun, would only hold 3. That tells me this grease, as they showed me at the State Fair on the Timken Bearing machine, not only wears the metal less, but it'll cut my volume of usage in half by staying where it's put.

I'm kind of a lubrication nut and have tried just about every grease on the market. I was even a distributor for a synthetic oil and grease before switching back to a good grade high-temp grease.

My wife just about had a cow when I spent \$15.00 for a tube of grease. Now, however, seeing what this stuff will do and the downtime, repair cost and stress it will save, we have become Power Up dealers.
